

CALL FOR PARTICIPATION

These carefully selected themes aim to stimulate thought-provoking discussions, encourage interdisciplinary perspectives, and contribute to the overarching goal of envisioning a just and harmonious multipolar world. The interested scholars are welcome to propose different topics as well.
